


5 steps are required to achieve universal access to high-speed broadband.






NYS has made and will continue to make substantial investments in expanding broadband service throughout the State.






The PSC map currently contains errors that can be identified only by people with local knowledge.



11 addresses on the west shore of Lake Kiwassa are shown as unserved, when they in fact have service > 100 Mbps.

11 addresses on Lake Kiwassa's outlet are shown as served when they in fact have NO service.



Fiber along Rte 9N in Moriah doesn't have enough capacity to support residential hookups. These addresses have NO service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for broadband service.
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for equipment.


Who Is Eligible?

- Household income at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.
- Or a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:
 - Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year.
 - Participates in one of these assistance programs:
 - The National School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program.
 - SNAP.
 - Medicaid.
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance.
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI).
 - WIC.
 - Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits.
 - Lifeline.

Only about 1/2 of the eligible households in NYS have signed up for the Affordable Connectivity Program. *





Two steps are required to apply for the Affordable Connectivity Program.

 - Call: 877-384-2575
- **Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.**
 - Submit an application via [AffordableConnectivity.gov](https://affordableconnectivity.gov).
 - Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.



In the US, over 40% of older Americans live without access to in-home wireline broadband service.

Older Adults Technology Services (OATS) is working to improve digital literacy for older adults in the North Country.

Report Card: North County

- Total enrollment was **852 people**, with a median age of 73. Participants were 64 percent female, 89 percent white, 40 percent with a disability, and 35 percent living alone.
- **77** percent reported feeling more confident living independently as a result of the program.
- **83** percent reported a higher quality of life.
- **40** percent purchased a technology device, and **33** percent reported signing up for home broadband or intending to do so in the near future.
- **98** percent said they would recommend the program to a friend or family member (Net Promoter Score).

Schmidt Futures Grant

- Received \$250,000 grant.
- Working with:
 - Northern NY Library Network
 - Southern Adirondack Library Network
 - Clinton-Essex-Franklin Library Network
- To teach older adults how to use technology to improve their lives.
